The school system is currently asking for more money from the county just to maintain business as usual in spite of projected increases in the number of students. As you know we are experiencing difficult economic times both nationally and locally and our schools will be affected. The superintendent's recommendations are on the www.FCPS.edu website in a tiered format that ranges in reductions from \$35 million to \$223 million dollars. It is not yet clear exactly how our services will be changed.

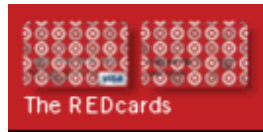

LAFF (Lost and Found Fridays)

SEES' PTA has taken on the task of trying to reunite lost items with your children. On the second or third Friday of every month, PTA volunteers will staff the *Lost and Found* area of the cafeteria. Please encourage your child(ren) to look over the items on display to see if anything belongs to them.

You can help increase the chances of reuniting lost items with your child(ren) by printing your last name on all items worn or brought to school – this includes books, lunch boxes, musical instruments, in addition to clothing items and outerwear. Simply print your last name in an easy-to-spot location such as on the neck tag inside a garment, on the inside of the top of a lunchbox, on the inside cover of a book, on a piece of tape placed on the outside of a musical instrument case, or any other conspicuous area. The PTA appreciates your effort in labeling the items your child(ren) bring to school and for reminding your child(ren) to look for their lost items on Lost and Found Fridays (LAFF).

Inclement Weather

FCPS has several schedules set up to deal with inclement weather. These are put into effect when conditions threaten the safety of children and FCPS staff who are walking, driving, or riding buses to schools. These schedules are:

(1) Keep schools closed. (2) Open two hours late. (3) Close two hours early.

As soon as a decision is made to implement one of these changes, we post the information on FCPS cable Channel 21 and place the message on our web site - www.fcps.edu. E-mail notifications will be made through our KIT system. Parents, please make sure to have your contact information updated on your child's emergency form at school. The news will also be carried by radio and television stations, which are notified as quickly as possible after a decision is made.
